

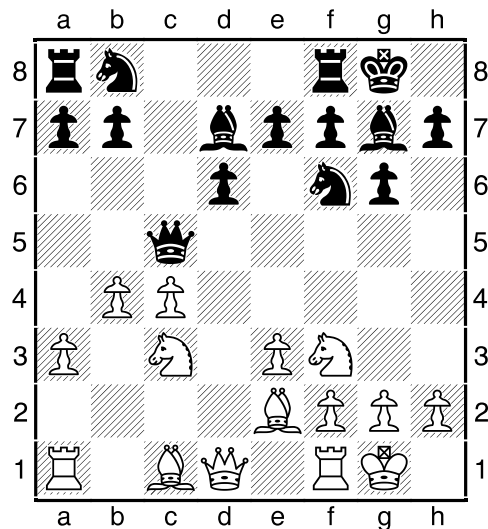

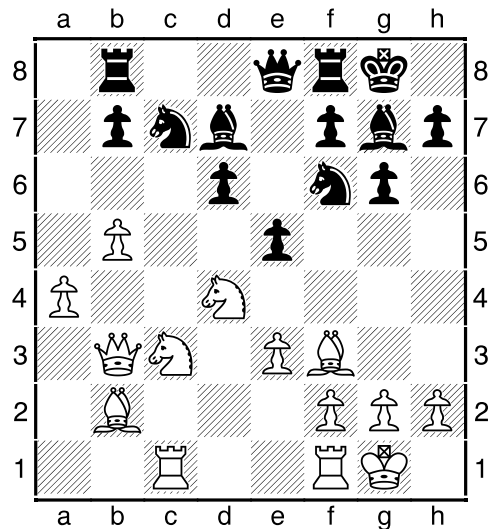

1. Nf3 d6 2. d4 Nf6 3. c4 c5 4. dxc5 Qa5+ (4... dxc5 5. Qxd8+ Kxd8) 5. Nc3 Qxc5 6. e3 g6 7. Be2 Bg7 8. O-O Bd7 9. a3 O-O 10. b4

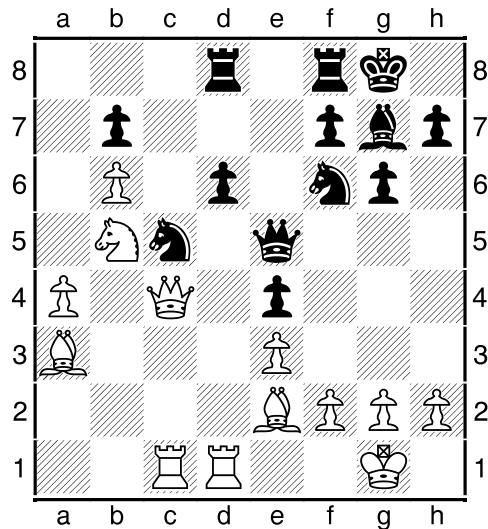


10...Qc8 11. Bb2 Na6 12. Rc1 Nc7 13. Qb3 Qe8 14. Nd4 Rc8 15. Bf3 Rb8 16. a4 a6 17. b5 axb5 18. cxb5 e5

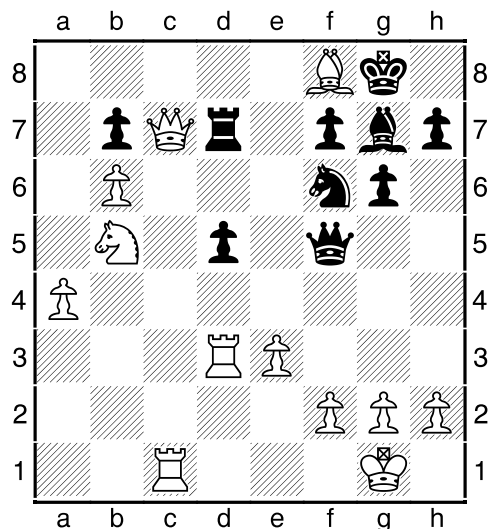


19. b6 Key move, only move to keep attack going. 19...Na6 20. Ndb5 My last move make space for the Knight to move into a more attacking square 21...Nc5 21. Qd1 Bxb5 22. Nxb5 Rd8 23. Qc2 e4 24. Be2 Qe7 25. Ba3 (25. Rfd1 was better.) 25... Rc8 26. Na7 wanted Rook to move off same file as my Queen,

but Rfd1 would also be better. 26...Rcd8 27. Rfd1 Qe6 28. Qc4 Qe5 29. Nb5



29...Nd3 30. Bxd3 exd3 31. Rxd3 d5 32. Qc7 Qf5 33. Bxf8 Rd7



34. Qc2 (34.Bxg7!!; 34. Bd6 Rxc7 35. bxc7 Qc8 36. Na7 would of been a nice way to finish off the game but miss that opportunity.) 34... Bxf8 35. Rc3 Bh6 36. Qxf5 gxf5 37. Rc7 f4 38. exf4 Bxf4 39. Re1 d4 (39... Bxc7 40. bxc7 wouldn't be too good for black as he can't stop the Pawn) 40. Re4 This was a very bad move. I still can't believe I played that. All my good work should of been wasted with that move and ended in a draw but my opponent miss it. 40...Bd2 (40... Bxc7 41. bxc7 Rxc7 42. Nxc7 Nxe4 likely be a draw now.) 41. Rxd7 Nxd7 42. Rxd4 Nxb6 43. Rxd2 Nxa4 44. Rd7 Nc5 45. Rc7 b6 46. Nd6 Ne6 47. Rxf7 b5 48. Rb7 1-0
